THE FIRST GEOPARK IN SOUTHEAST ASIA

Langkawi UNESCO Global Geopark (LUGGp) is the only global geopark covering the entire archipelago of 99 tropical islands. Spanning 47,848 hectares, Langkawi can be found approximately 25km north-west of Malaysia on the Andaman Sea. A large portion of the island is made up of flat plains accentuated by limestone ridges, forests, hills and mountains.

Section 1 GEOFOREST

Langkawi's 4 Wonders

Fun Facts

Did you know, Langkawi Geopark is the first geopark in Southeast Asia? On top of that, the Machinchang Rock Formation nestled within the Machinchang Geoforest Park is the oldest in Southeast Asia. The 550-million-year-old mountain is also the location of the SkyCab and the SkyBridge. Completed in 2005, the SkyBridge is suspended from an 82-metre-high single pylon and at 125-metres in length, it's one of the longest curved suspension bridges in the world.



Kilim Karst

The largest of the three geoforest parks, Kilim Karst Geoforest Park is located in the east of Langkawi Island and is named after Kilim River that runs through the park. A predominantly mangrove forest, Kilim Karst Geoforest Park is known for its formation formed by the erosion of limestone. The limestone dates back to the Setul Formation which gave rise to multiple sea arches, stacks and pinnacles.

What makes Kilim Karst Geoforest Park so unique is that the mangrove forest has given birth to an ecosystem consisting of all kinds of rare flora and fauna, these include the Cycas clivicola or Limestone Cycad, a primeval gymnosperm which grows in the crevices of cliffs, Hibiscus tiliaceus a yellow sea hibiscus that's almost neon in colour and the Brhamniny Reddish Brown Kite Sea Eagle that inspired the name of Langkawi as well as the White-Bellied Sea Eagle. Known for its remarkable geological and biological sites, Machinchang Cambrian Geoforest Park is located in the northwest of Langkawi Island. With mountain peaks that will take your breath away carved by weather and time as well as lush waterfalls, narrow valleys and perpendicular cliffs, there is so much to discover.


What makes Machinchang Cambrian Geoforest Park truly unique is its exotic flora and fauna, these include the majestic Great Hornbill perched often high up in the forest canopy viewed best from the SkyBridge and the climbing bamboo known for its biomechanical characteristics.




Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park © 6.2376, 99.8071 (Must Visit: Pulau Ular, Pulau Tuba Sill, Pulau Singa Kechil Plateau)

Named after Dayang Bunting Lake, also known as the Lake of the Pregnant Maiden due to the contour of hills resembling a pregnant woman, the lake is actually really famous for some believe the lake aids those suffering from infertility. Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park is home to the freshwater lake created by a roof of the cave to form the dolina or brackish water lake.

What makes Dayang Bunting Marble Geoforest Park stand out is the thrust fault that travels from north to south, elevated by ancient Setul Limestone right next to the much more recent Chuping Limestone responsible for the island's caves, sea arches and sea stack formations.







White-Bellied Sea Eag

Recognised for its unique tidal river estuary ecosystem full of geological diversity, Kubang Badak has a large estuary of young mangrove forest covers along the northern coast of Langkawi, east of the Machinchang Range.

What makes Kubang Badak BioGeoTrail so exceptional is its untouched mangroves and distinguished cultural history. Kubang Badak was actually an early Thai settlement, and the impact of cultures colliding has shaped Langkawi immensely when it comes to cultural and heritage aspects.

Pantai Pasir Tengkorak (Must Do: Picnicking & GeoTrail Exploring) © 6.4308, 99.7259

This geosite is located on a rocky shore in the northern part of Langkawi, stretching from Pantai Pasir Tengkorak to Tanjung Buta where the old continent was submerged and features sedimentary structures showcasing crucial evidence of the sedimentary deposition process of the Machinchang Formation that occurred in deltas and coastal environments during the Cambrian Period (550-505 million years).



Pantai Teluk Yu (Must Do: Sunbathing, Swimming, Food Truck Hopping, Sight-Seeing, Picniking) © 6.4308, 99.7259

Teluk Yu is an extension of Pasir Hitam Beach and has exquisite panoramic views of the open ocean.





A great site for snorkelling and diving, Pulau Payar Marine Park is a great place to see amazing and colourful marine life including corals, urchins, sea slugs and starfish.



Pulau Tuba (Must Do: Trek to Gua Wang Buluh, Birdwatching, Kayaking & Cycling) © 6.2366, 99.8404

Pulau Tuba is one of Langkawi's three most populated islands and features a traditional fishing village and is a great place for homestay escapes where nature lovers can go cave exploring, jungle trekking and bird watching. Bukit Kecil is the best place to view the island's twisted, stacked rock formation, a unique feature to forests here.





One of the larger islands and the biggest within the Kilim Geoforest Park, Pulau Langgun houses a cape to the north called Tanjung Langgun, a bay to the east called Teluk Dalam and a bay to the west called Teluk Mempelam. It's a great site to explore the Setul Formation and even has a lake in the middle.

A great dive site with a wide array of fish, Pulau Cepu also known as Pulau Topi is a scenic islet with a narrow staircase that goes up to a tiny light house that's visible from the bottom of the island. Stingrau





Pulau Dayang Bunting (Must Do: Junale Trekkina, Paddle Boating & Kayaking) © 6.2376, 99.8071

The second largest uninhibited island, Pulau Dayang Bunting is easily accessible via a 15-minute boat ride from Kuah Jetty. Once you get to the jetty, it's another 15-minute hike to the lake via a concrete stairway through the forest.

Located to the southwest of Langkawi Island, Pulau Intan Besar and Pulau Intan Kecil are two uninhabited islands. Yes, you heard right. Both these islands are a great place to snorkle and fish

A great place for relaxation, family fun and crystal clear waters perfect for snorkelling and diving, Pulau Dangli is the perfect place for some peace and relaxing and guiet by the sea.





Gunung Raya 0 6.3697, 99.8185

Standing mighty and tall at 881 metres, hiking enthusiasts can conquer the mountain's via road or by climbing 4,287 steep steps, called Tangga Helang Seribu Kenangan. It is the highest mountain of Langkawi, experience it's impenetrable rainforest habitat, formed atop the 220-200-million-year-old granite foundation. Surrounded by dense forest reserves, be sure to catch sight of or take pictures of dusky leaf monkeys, flying foxes, macaque monkeys, great hornbills and more here. The duration of trek up to the top will take between 11/2-2 hours, coming down takes half the time.

Ascending Mountains & Descending into Caverns


From the highest mountain in Langkawi, we make our descent into caverns deep within the

heart of the island and witness the amazing flora and fauna that has developed over time.



Gua Cherita

Known for its mythylogical story of the "Battle of Giant Birds", Gua Cherita consists of two caves that sit quaintly on top of one another facing the sea. Inside, there are old Arabic inscriptions, more mythical stories and ornate stone formations. Take a boat from Tanjung Rhu or Kilim Jetty; there are lots of boatmen offering deals to get you around.

Gua Kelawar

Gua Kelawar means Bat Cave even though vou won't find Batman, but you will most certainly find

plenty of Insect Eating Bats. Part of the Kilim Karst Geoforest Park, you will need a boat to get to the cave and be sure to bring a torch as you will need it in this dark cave, please take note as it will startle the sleeping bats.



It can be quite a challenging trek to get to but this cave is definitely worth checking out as it is speculated to have once been underwater as many sea shells can be found on its walls. It is now home to all kinds of creatures, including close to 7,000 bats.

Brown-Winged Kingfishe



Gua Langsir is 91 metres high and is named as such due to the echo of wind that passes through the cave that depicts a wailing sound. Easily accessible, this cave is suitable for cave enthusiasts and curious tourists alike, no experience needed.

Yet another unique cave that flows through the Kilim River, Gua Buaya is only accessible at low tide by a small boat. It was once the homes of actual crocodiles but today it is home to thousands of bats and limestone formations.



Gua Wang Buluh © 6.2456, 99.8467

Located 110 metres above sea level, Gua Wang Buluh is said to be the oldest caves in Malaysia. Filled with stalactites and stalagmites, the cave also showcases stone curtain pillars and ficus root plants.




Gua Landak © 6.3044, 99.8584

Gua Landak houses Paleolithic artifacts that are said to be 17,000 years old. It is called Gua Landak because it is typically frequented by porcupines and can be seen around the caves often.



Gua Selat Panchor © 6.1920, 99.5352

The view here is breathtaking and it's definitely worth the wait. The hike will lead you to the beach where you can relax for a while before exploring the Selat Panchor cave. The cave is best ventured with a guide. Be sure to bring waterproof shoes and be ready to get wet!





This 100-metre-long cave is small but there's definitely a lot to check out. Stalactites and stalagmites in all shapes and sizes including marble floors and walls create an ambience not found elsewhere.



Named after a tree and developed during the Setul Formation, Gua Dedap is known for its amazing views, once you get to it, which is through a tunnel connecting a bay with tranquil waters with marine or brackish water. The cave developed within the Setul Formation. During high tide the cave is only accessible by a small boat.













Crystalline Waterfalls to Calm Your Senses

Air Terjun Telaga Tujuh © 6.3778, 99.6740

The waterfall's namesake comprises of 7 pools of various depths, shapes, and sizes, these pools are connected by a river and form a 91-metre-high waterfall, this natural wonder is one of the island's most revered and majestic attractions. Be rewarded with the sights of magnificence while immersing yourself in nature's infinity pool. Adventurous tourists can try the steep 45-minute climb up to the top of the waterfalls, be sure to look out for Macaque Monkeys, Hornbills and Black Giant Squirells often found within the area.

ir Terjun Temurur

Air Terjun Temurun ◎ 6.4340, 99.7082

Great for picnics, Air Terjun Temurun is three tiers with a 200-metre drop making it the highest waterfall in Langkawi. Streams of this waterfall flow off Gunung Machinchang in the north and consists mainly of shale and sandstone dating back 550 million years.

A hidden gem, not frequented by tourist as much as the other waterfalls, Air Terjun Durian Perangin is still as amazing in appearance. Air Terjun Durian Perangin gets its name from the numerous Durian Trees that surround it and can be found at the north of Gunung Raya.

With some of the best views of Langkawi, Lubuk Semilang Waterfalls is located within the Lubuk Semilang Tropical Forest. It's a great place to venture with a picnic area, clear rivers, prayer rooms, toilets and rest huts.

As one of the best waterfall hikes in Langkawi, Air Terjun Tama is hidden on an island where you will need to take a 20-minute boat ride to get to from Jeti Nelayan LKIM Sg. Chenang, Jeti Nelayan Perdana Quay or Kubang Badak Jetty. The hike up to the top of Langkawi's tallest waterfall will take about 30 to 45 minutes, it can be intimidating, be sure to wear proper shoes, as the hiking trail can be slippery and rocky. Leap into the turquoise swimming hole and dive into the deepest watering holes in Langkawi. Air Terjun Tama can only be accessed if you sign up for a local package tour.
